# PLANNING FOR OUR FUTURE LEADERS

Dear Friends and Supporters of ACE,

**As we reflect on the past year, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude for the achievements and progress we have made together during the 2023-2024 program year.**

It has been a transformative year for the ACE Mentor Program of Northeast Florida (ACE NEFL), marked by significant milestones, inspiring stories and a renewed commitment to empowering the next generation of architects, engineers and construction professionals.

## Program Growth and Impact

This year, we welcomed 222 students from diverse backgrounds into the program. Our dedicated mentors, now over 87 industry professionals, have been instrumental in providing hands-on learning experiences, fostering students' interest in the construction industry and helping them develop critical skills for their future careers.

One of our most significant achievements this year has been the successful expansion of our program to Paxon School for Advanced Studies. This growth marks a crucial step in our mission to reach more students, especially in under-served communities. Paxon, known for its academic excellence and commitment to student development, has proven to be an ideal partner in our efforts to cultivate the next generation of industry professionals. With 11 students enrolled in the inaugural year, the program has already begun to make a substantial impact.

The Year-End Event has grown significantly in the past few years. Now having 26 teams presenting, attendees had the opportunity to view innovative projects developed by the students over the past year. These projects showcased the creativity, technical skills and collaborative spirit fostered by the ACE Mentor Program.

## Scholarships

This year, we announced a record \$76,000 in scholarship awards to deserving students, ensuring that financial barriers do not hinder their pursuit of higher education and professional development. These scholarships,

awarded to 21 graduating seniors and 2 junior mentors, have enabled many of our students to attend prestigious universities and technical schools, furthering their education and career aspirations.

## Innovative Programs and Partnerships

In an unwavering commitment to nurturing future leaders and empowering local youth, Brasfield & Gorrie's Jacksonville office selected ACE Mentor Program of Northeast Florida as its primary fundraising beneficiary for the years 2024-2026. Funds raised through their Cowford Invitational Golf Tournament, Impact Week Cornhole Tournament and employee matching will directly benefit ACE. Beyond financial support, employees have committed to actively participate as mentors, guest speakers, committee members and board members, underscoring the holistic approach towards creating a lasting impact in the community.

Our commitment to innovation has led to the development of new programs and partnerships aimed at enhancing the ACE Mentor experience. We remain committed to expanding our reach, enhancing our programs and ensuring that every student, regardless of background, can explore and succeed in architecture, engineering and construction.

Dear ACE Supporters and Friends:

**This past year, ACE continued to grow and develop into one of the best ACE affiliates in the country. We were able to share our strategic plan and lessons learned over the past 18 years by presenting at the 2024 ACE Regional Conference.**

This year the program received national recognition with Creekside High School winning the overall National CIRT Competition award in Washington, DC. Below are some more of our 2023-2024 accomplishments:

- Our Executive Director, Nicole Eubanks, continues to be extremely effective in her role and has become well known in Northeast Florida. She continues to push and help grow our program throughout the area.
- We now serve 12 schools (including our Home School Team) in the area with adding Paxon School for Advanced Studies to the program.
- School expansion increased the number of students served from 190 to 222 and increased mentor participation from 85 to 87.
- We successfully met our fundraising goals via program sponsorships, annual clay shoot, board donations and other events.
- We distributed \$76,000 in scholarships to 21 of our seniors and 2 Junior Mentors.
- ACE NEFL also successfully competed for and won a sponsorship engagement from the Brasfield & Gorrie Cowford Invitational Golf Tournament. This is a three-year commitment where ACE NEFL will receive the proceeds from the golf tournament, silent auction, impact week and employee giving.

This completes my first year as Board Chair and as you can see, our affiliate is doing very well. We are very fortunate to have such great support from the students, teachers, mentors, committees, Board of Directors and most importantly our donors. Judy Deshler, current Board Member and PR Committee Chair, has graciously accepted the position as Vice Chair. It has been a privilege and honor to lead such a dedicated group of board members that are focused on the future success of the program.

# ACE MENTOR PROGRAM OF NORTHEAST FL



Founded during the 2006-2007 school year, the ACE Mentor Program of Northeast Florida (ACE NEFL) helps high school students explore potential careers in architecture, construction and engineering. Through the program, mentors from local industry professional firms meet with students once a week for 18-20 weeks. During these sessions, students work in teams to create practical solutions for “real-world” projects. It’s an effective way for students to experience the reality of what architects, contractors and engineers do during a typical working day.

The 2023-2024 program year was a success both in terms of students served and donations raised from industry partners, individuals and foundations. ACE NEFL increased our reach to 12 locations, serving 222 students weekly and awarded \$76,000 to 21 high school seniors and 2 junior mentors.

## What is ACE?

Founded in 1994, the ACE Mentor Program of America (ACE) is a free, award-winning, after-school program designed to attract high school students into pursuing careers in the Architecture, Construction and Engineering industry, including skilled trades. ACE has grown to more than 75 affiliates (chapters), operating throughout the US and Canada, largely based in metropolitan areas. A national office supports the affiliate programs.

ACE is one of the fastest growing programs in the country, serving over 10,000 students annually, drawn from approximately 1,500 high schools. The majority of ACE students (70%) are minority, and over 40% are female. More than 40% of ACE seniors entering college are first generation scholars.

More than 4,000 volunteer industry professionals mentor student teams through a 35-hour-long simulation of designing and constructing a project.

Last year nearly \$4 million was awarded in scholarships to high school seniors and alumni studying to pursue industry-related careers. More than 90% of ACE alumni pursue college degrees or skilled trade training. ACE also offers students summer camp and internship opportunities. Finally, ACE estimates that 2,000+ alumni enter the AEC workforce each year.

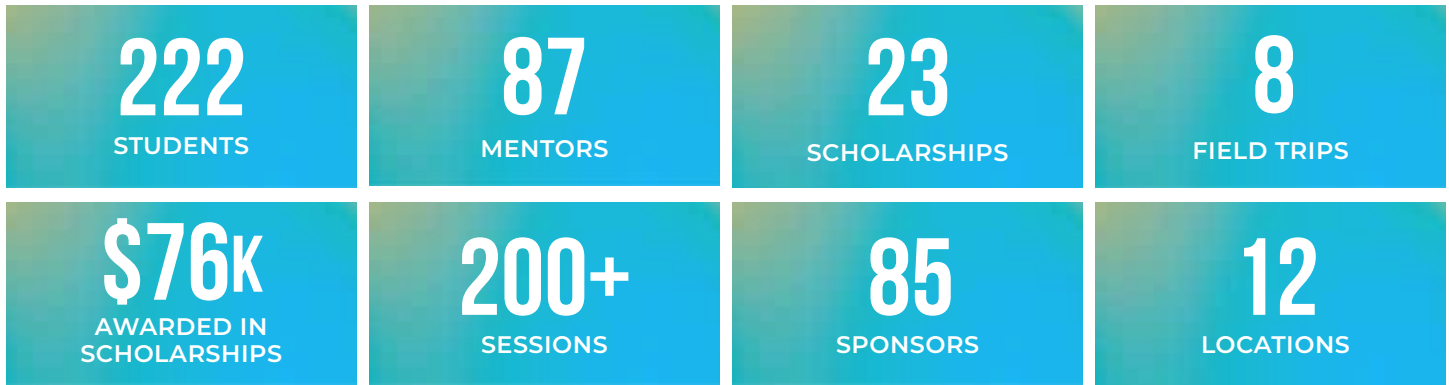

# EDUCATION

## BY THE NUMBERS



### 2023-24 PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The program continued its growth and enjoyed a successful 2023-2024. We served 222 students across Northeast Florida, including 60 female students and 82 students from under-represented groups.

Students met for as few as 15 weeks at 12 different locations: Atlantic Coast High School, Bartram Trail High School, Bishop Kenny High School, Creekside High School, Middleburg High School, Nease High School, Orange Park High School, Paxon School for Advanced Studies (new location), Pedro Menendez High School, Riverside High School, Toco Creek High School and our Home School Team.

This year's request for proposals (RFP) competition had three topics to choose from and we had 26 teams compete.

- Highway Interchange (4 teams)
- Olympic Venue (10 teams)
- Shoreline (8 teams)
- CIRT National Design and Construction (4 teams)

### ENGAGING STUDENTS

Our program is open to Northeast Florida high school students who have the curiosity and drive to learn about a career in design and construction — from contracting and engineering to architecture and landscaping. 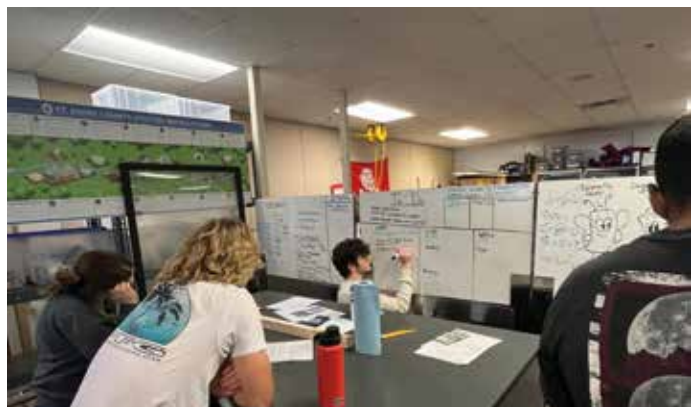

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## 2024 CIRT NATIONAL DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION COMPETITION

Four ACE NEFL teams submitted their projects for the 2024 Construction Industry Round Table (CIRT) Design and Construction Competition. The competition is maintained, coordinated and judged by CIRT and is sponsored for ACE Mentor Program affiliate teams. From a record-tying total of 64 entries, one NEFL team was selected as one of the three finalists.

Creekside High School's Highway Interchange team presented their response at the CIRT Spring Meeting on April 29, 2024 at the Willard Intercontinental Hotel in Washington, D.C.

Following high-level presentations from each of the three finalists, Creekside was selected as the winner, the best response in the nation, and won a prize of \$5,000. This is our affiliate's fourth time with a finalist and our first victory.



# YEAR-END EVENT

The ACE Mentor Program of Northeast Florida wrapped up its student programming with a Year-End Event on April 30th at the Schultz Center. The celebration highlighted:

- **Scholarships:** We awarded scholarships totaling \$76,250 to 21 deserving seniors and 2 junior mentors pursuing careers in architecture, construction and engineering. These scholarships are made possible through corporate giving at the diamond, gold and silver level.
- **Student Projects:** Student teams presented their project in a competition for best proposal and best presentation. The projects showcased their innovation and technical skills and included a model of a trades component of the project.
- **Special Recognition:** Monique Bell received national honors as the Exemplary School Champion (teacher), and Tom Grogan was awarded ACE NEFL Outstanding Mentor. We also acknowledged the retirement of significant program contributors Wayne Petrone and Kevin Davenport.
- **Volunteer Appreciation:** The event closed with a heartfelt appreciation of our mentors, teachers, volunteers and parents in the vital role they each play in supporting ACE student success.

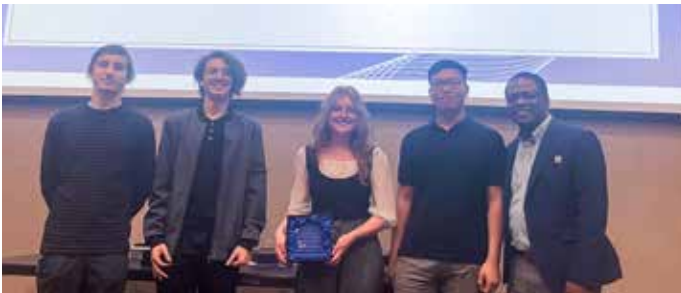

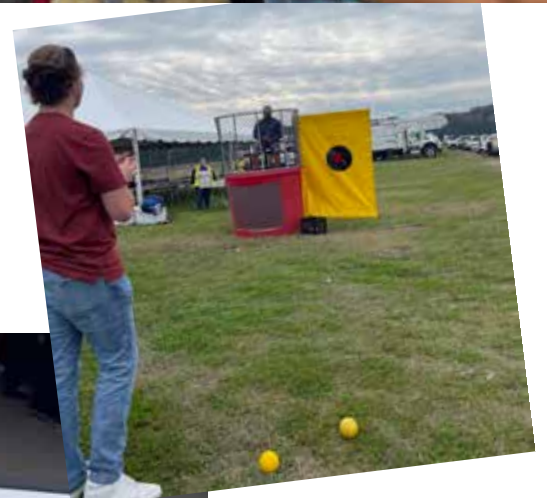
